## Proposed Referral to the Enlarged Board of Appeal


Dear Mr Josefsson,

It is now well known that a Board of Appeal (3.5.02) will be referring one or more questions to the Enlarged Board of Appeal regarding videoconference proceedings. As you know from previous correspondence from **epi**, we are very concerned about this topic and so have been monitoring the situation. We also assume that you will be, as far as possible, preparing for the new referral.

This is a matter of great importance not only for the Boards of Appeal but also for the Directorate General Patent Granting Process. It has already attracted a lot of interest with all users of the Office and the Boards. This can be seen, for instance, from the number of submissions the BOAC received regarding a proposed new Article 15a of the RPBA.

In such circumstances, it appears to **epi** that it is necessary for the Enlarged Board not only to be unbiased but also to appear to be unbiased. It is therefore suggested that the panel of the Enlarged Board of Appeal should not include anyone who was involved in the drafting and approval of the proposed Article 15a as it could be perceived that such people could be biased towards a finding consistent with Article 15a. We further suggest that the panel should not include those involved in the drafting and approval of the Notice dated 15 December 2020 which concluded that the Boards were already entitled to conduct oral proceedings by videoconference even without the agreement of the parties concerned, based on the premise that the proposed Article 15a merely clarifies an existing possibility.
